1. Subcommittee Restructuring

The committee discussed Chair Benac's suggested list of liaisons and subcommittees.

A Motion Was Made by Director Kreuzer Seconded by Zimmer to Schedule a Public Working Session to condense and modernize these groups

2. **Green Zoning/Space Preservation Report:** Discussion centered on defining "Green Zoning" and updating city codes to meet current climate and sustainability realities. The committee intends to invite the City Planner to a future meeting for further clarification.
3. **KMR Fire Update:** Commissioner Hess provided a formal city response to the March 9th, 2026, fire at Kalamazoo Metal Recycling
 - The fire burned for 14 hours, the specific cause is unknown
 - The city is expanding its air quality sensor network to include VOC detection and 24/7 alert protocols
 - Inspections (including drones) detected no oil sheen or discharge into the Kalamazoo River
4. **Asylum Lake Transfer:** The ECC continues to request a seat in the County Parks Department to assist in managing the Asylum Lake Preserve

H. NEW BUSINESS:

WMU Lighting and Noise: Concerns were raised regarding Western Michigan University's plans for night lighting and noise at its soccer facility, which is adjacent to Parkview Hills and Asylum Lake. Staff clarified that the city lacks direct jurisdiction over WMU property as it is a state entity.
